There were no questions or comments.

- 2. Presentations
- a. Update on the Alliance for a Healthier Generation by Lenea Pollett, Program Manager. She provided a PowerPoint presentation (copy attached to minutes). In regards to the California Fitness Gram Results, measurement of Body Mass Index (BMI) was required by the State of California for 5<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> graders. Vice-President Grayman commented that the 9<sup>th</sup> graders appeared to be the healthiest, at least by BMI criteria. Ms. Pollett explained that this is a typical result because the students in the 9<sup>th</sup> grade are more proportional therefore resulting in a lower BMI than they had in the 5<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> grades.

President Solomon commented that the Desert Sands Unified School District (DSUSD) had the best BMI results, which could be attributed to a stronger socio-economic area than the students in either Coachella Valley Unified School District (CVUSD) or Palm Springs Unified School District (PSUSD). Other highlights of her report include:

- CVUSD and PSUSD have 100% of their school participating in the Alliance.
- DSUSD have 100% of their employees involved in a wellness program.
- 60 schools in the Coachella Valley have qualified for additional recognition and exclusive funding opportunities from the Michelle Obama's "Let's Move Active Schools" program.
- Schools in all 3 districts have shared use agreements, opening school grounds and building to the community for physical activities during times when the buildings and grounds are not in use.
- The Humana Foundation awarded \$83,000 to the schools with strong participation in the Alliance curriculum.

Ms. Greco had no items to report.
