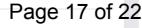

Re: WEST VALLEY HOMELESSNESS INITIATIVE

Staff recommendations (2):

- 1. Consideration to approve the establishment of a collective fund for the West Valley Homelessness Initiative and accept any future matching funds
- 2. Consideration to accept \$2,000,000 from the Desert Healthcare District to fund the West Valley Homelessness Initiative Collective Fund

Desert Healthcare District is leading the effort to align public and philanthropic resources to support Housing First and low-or-no barrier programs in the West Valley cities. The recommendations are based on matching contributions to programs and services that will create a more collaborative and coordinated way to address the issue of homelessness and reflect a continuum of interconnected strategies ranging from sheltering to wrap around services to housing to behavioral health (mental health & substance use disorders) services necessary to solve the problem of homelessness.

POSITION: On April 25, 2017, the Desert Healthcare Board of Directors approved a collaborative/collective fund, up to \$2 million, that supports programs and infrastructure to address the homelessness crisis in the Coachella Valley. The fund will be supported by various funding agencies including foundations and corporations. Strategies to accomplish the overall goal would be developed based on community needs and priorities and in accordance with funder's guidelines; DESERT HEALTHCARE FOUNDATION would ultimately be responsible for the administration of all funds.

At the May 23, 2017 Desert Healthcare District Board of Directors meeting, the directors discussed priorities in their leadership role of the organization's WEST VALLEY HOMELESSNESS INITIATIVE and ultimately approved at their June 27, 2017 meeting, to fully fund the West Valley Homelessness Initiative collective fund in the amount of \$2 million, which includes all funding availability for future matches. The first implementation of the fund has begun – short term supporting rapid rehousing with wrap around services. The District has committed \$103,000 to CVAG's West Valley Navigation Program and recognized those cities that had already confirmed their \$103,000 contribution with a dollar to dollar match in their name, to the Navigation Program and challenging those cities that have not yet committed also with a match in their name to the Navigation Program. The committed cities to

date are Palm Springs, Rancho Mirage, Palm Desert and Coachella. The matched amount to the West Valley Navigation Program to date is \$412,000.

OTHER MATCHING OPPORTUNTIES: The District board is also leading in an innovative collaborative with the City of Palm Springs in matching funds to support wrap around services \$100,000 (case manager & employment specialists at specially selected sites serving the homeless) and \$350,000 expanded personnel (Mental Health Housing Crisis Team~ pairing non-uniformed police officers with County Mental Health behaviorists) for a \$450,000 match total. This match with the City of Palm Springs is an example of matches that are available to other cities in the West.
